



*“Holistic Emergency Care and Trauma Recovery for Humans and Animals
Alike Clinic”
Agenda and Outline - Calgary, Canada*

Overview Notes:

It is intended that the participants will be enrolled no later than one week prior to the clinic, thus allowing them to receive a copy of the text to read before coming to the clinic itself. This will allow each person to have a basic understanding of the “road map” that we will be following and where their level of understanding is in the different modalities and sections.

I am also intending that participants will present specific questions and situations of concern to me (instructor) at least three days prior to the clinic, so that, where possible and appropriate, I can address them for the entire class.

Objective: The goals and objectives of this 3-day hands-on experiential clinic include the following:

- To provide the participants with an understanding of what holistic emergency care is and how to provide it on basic levels to humans and animals alike.
- To provide participants with the tools and understanding of applying holistic modalities to emergency situations at a standard first aid level.
- To provide participants with a basic working knowledge of homeopathy, herbology, flower essences and essential oils and other vibrational healing modalities as outlined in the book.



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- To assist participants in understanding unity consciousness as it applies to humans and animals – in general and emergency environments.
- To assist participants in awakening their abilities in intuitive communication between humans, animals and divine assistance, including Spirit Medical Teams (SMTs).
- To assist participants in understanding and embracing animals and all other life as equal, intelligent beings who are here to teach us as well as learn from us.

Friday Evening, October 26th

Outline: Section I in Table of Contents of text. On Friday night we will introduce/review with the class our ideas of holistic emergency care and trauma recovery. We will be providing basic examples of life situations where this

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knowledge has been utilized to assist and facilitate healing for humans and animals alike.

Saturday, October 27th

Morning: Outline: Section II in TOC of text.

We will also be going over the basic modalities being utilized in the clinic and book: homeopathy, herbology, flower essences and connecting with divine assistance. As outlined in the text, this section will also cover basic members of each group that are utilized for emergencies and trauma recovery, their properties and varied applications.

There is much to cover in this section. So reading the materials ahead of class is a must for everyone. This once again emphasizes the requirement for pre-registration for the clinic; (cut off being one week in advance of the clinic).

This will include a 30-minute discussion period and Q/A for the material covered thus far in the course.

Afternoon:

1. The initial piece of the afternoon will be the introduction of the idea of working with Spirit Medical Teams – God’s assistants on various levels during emergencies. We understand that there may be a varied level of comfort in connecting with this type of divine assistance. And the depth that we journey into this type of holistic assistance will to some degree be dependant upon the class participants themselves and their comfort level.

Our advanced clinics will focus more attention on divine assistance. This beginning level is where the introduction is made and awareness activated.

Note: It is our opinion that receiving and utilizing divine assistance in emergencies and trauma recovery is one of God’s greatest gifts for

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practitioners. It is also our understanding through our own journey, that most embrace this assistance in various degrees as their hearts and minds open to the gifts they provide.

2. After mid-afternoon break, we will move into Section III of the text, “First Responder Instructions,” with the intention of moving through “Types of Wounds” before the end of the day. See Table of Contents.

This portion of the class is a combination of lecture, demonstration and hands-on practical. I will go through each section of the book, demonstrate the process and then break the class into pairs/groups for the hands-on practice. We will be reviewing the standard first aid basics plus the applications of holistic modalities, including divine assistance.

Note: It will be an advantage for the class participants to have knowledge of standard first aid either through a class or the reading of such text before the Holistic Clinic.

Sunday, October 28th (2.5 day clinic)

Outline: Completion of Section III in TOC of text.

It is our intention to complete Section III by mid-afternoon, beginning with “Controlling Bleeding”, and move into Section IV, “Acute Illness and Trauma Recovery”, briefly before the end of the clinic. (Section IV is more advanced and is being made into its own 3-day clinic at this time.)

(3.5 day clinic – October 26th – 29th)

Note: For those participants who wish to attend an additional day of trauma recovery, the additional day is \$70CAD. See registration information for more details.

Sunday, October 28th

Outline: Completion of Section III in TOC of text.

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It is our intention to complete Section III by mid-afternoon, beginning with “Controlling Bleeding”. Then we will move into Section IV, “Acute Illness and Trauma Recovery”, briefly before ending for the day, covering “How to Proceed Once the Situation is Stabilized”, and time allowing “Healing Mental and Emotional Trauma”.

Monday, October 29th

Outline: Completion of Section IV, “Acute Illness and Trauma Recovery” in TOC of text

It is our intention to complete Section IV, “Acute Illness and Trauma Recovery” at a basic level on this day. This area is an ongoing study and the skills to assist can be continuously developed over time. Song of The Dove Foundation will offer more advanced classes in this, some of which will be available on-line and as tele-classes. Here on this day, we will cover the sections in the text (see TOC), and get participants started on the journey of understanding and developing their own skills in holistic intuitive trauma recovery.
